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Redruth School More Able STEM Conference 2016

Tuesday 4th October saw the inaugural Redruth School Year 6 STEM (Science, Technology, English, Maths) conference, held in association with the University of Exeter. Year 6 pupils from 9 local primary schools attended a fun packed day where solutions to the problem of climate change were explored. Students enjoyed a number of hands on activities including; looking at environmentally friendly electricity production in cities, showing how leaves act as carbon dioxide sponges, testing solar cells and creating their own wind turbines.



The day also gave pupils a chance to meet and chat with university staff and students working in this and other areas of research. The pupils had a fantastic day expanding their understanding of climate change and possible solutions, their only complaint, was they wanted to do more maths!!!!
