## To help you take in what you hear and remember it!



### 1. 'I went shopping and I bought...'



The first person says what they bought. The next player repeats the first person and adds another item.

Play continues with each person repeating the phrase as it gets longer and longer.

This game can be varied endlessly e.g.

'I went to the beach and saw...'

'I went to the cinema and I saw.....which starred.....'

### 2. **Opposites**



Say a sentence and the other person has to recall the opposite of the sentence e.g.

'The quick hairy spider scuttled under the big rock.'

becomes

'The slow smooth spider crawled over the little rock.'

## To help you take in what you see and remember it!



### 1. Tray Game



- Memorising objects on a tray to recall them without looking (visual memory)
- Studying objects on a tray before objects are moved, removed or added (visual processing/memory)
